#### 5. Background information about the organization

Mary Rice Centre for Special Education started offering services to persons with disability as early as 1989, when such services were rare in this part of the country. It started as a day care centre in a rented two roomed accommodation at Holy Cross Villa, Red Hill Road, Laitumkhrah, Shillong with 2 students. Today, the centre reaches out to over 100 students daily. The school building stands on land donated by the Congregation of Christian Brothers at Lady Veronica Lane, Laitumkhrah, Shillong. The building was funded by Light for the World, an Austrian funding agency and The Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India.

#### Meet Radhika



Radhika Biswas came to Mary Rice Centre for Special Education at the age of 5 years with a diagnosis of Down's Syndrome with Delayed Speech & Language. She was admitted to the Early Intervention Unit in 2016. When she joined she was able to follow one word instructions and do simple activities when given full prompts. She had difficulties in performing eye-hand co-ordination activities. She had unclear speech.

She was admitted to the day school in 2017 and with intensive intervention Radhika has shown improvement and is presently placed in class 1. She communicates with her classmates and teachers verbally (in one word) or through gestures and can now follow 2 simple related instructions. She enjoys singing rhymes and library time as she gets to look at different pictures and listen to different stories read by the teacher. She has made a lot of friends and helps her classmates like putting their bags in the proper places, arranging things properly in the class. She co-operates and interacts well with other students in the school. She has now started to write the letters of the English Alphabet and numerals. She has number concept 1 - 3. She can match, sort and identify simple common objects and pictures. She is able to do selfcare like brushing teeth, dressing/undressing, grooming, feeding and clean self after using the toilet. She enjoys coming to the school and participates in all school activities.

#### Meet Fernando



Fernando was a class II student in a regular junior school. His parents brought him to Mary Rice Centre for Special Education because his academic performance was not at par with other students of his class. He came to our centre as an Out Patient on 29<sup>th</sup> Sept 2014, and joined MRCE in March 2015 and was placed in class III. He was able to answer questions related to the topic orally but had difficulties in reading, writing and spelling simple and familiar words. He had problem behaviors and would throw tantrums and did not cooperating in activities given.

Over the years and with intervention Fernando has shown improvements in many areas i.e functional academic, writing skills, home skills and social skills. He can now write simple sentences related to simple questions given, copy independently from the board and

books and even answers questions related to the topics through mind- mapping and drawings. He is good in drawing. He communicates well with others and is very helpful in the class. He can follow complex instructions, can relate to a story told by the teacher and answer correctly to the questions related to it. He actively participates in activities assigned to him. He loves co - curricular activities especially cooking and wants to become a successful chef in the future. He was selected to participate in the Inclusive Children Parliament Zonal meet held in Kohima in Oct 2018 and participated well in the programme. He represents the school in various programmes and activities outside school.

Apart from the daily educational programme of the school the other activities were:

#### 1. World Autism Day

April 2nd is observed as World Autism Day and the whole month as awareness month. Flex posters were put up on this day to create awareness among students, parents and the community at large. The school campus was lighted blue at night.

Ms. A.L.Massar, Sp. Ed gave a talk on 'Empowering Women and Girls with Autism' in a programme organized by Sanker on this day.

# 2. <u>Regional Action on Inclusive Education- North East (RAISE-NE)</u>

RAISE-NE was initiated in 2016 to complement the programme of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan on Inclusive Education to improve the quality of education for children with disabilities in government/ government supported schools in selected districts of Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Nagaland and Tripura. Mary Rice Centre is one of the 12 organisations involved and the Key Teachers have been trained to support these selected schools in inclusive education. The INGOs supporting this project are Light for the World, Liliane Fonds and CBM.

#### 3. <u>B.Ed SEDE Classes</u>

Mary Rice Centre for Special Education is a study centre of the B.Ed SEDE (MR) under NEHU. The final exam was conducted in July 2018 and the results were declared in February 2019. All the candidates passed.

#### 4. Independence Day Celebration

A programme was organised by Society for The Welfare of the Disabled on 15th August '18 to celebrate Independence Day. Students from both the units of the Society for The Welfare of The Disabled i.e School and Centre for the Hearing Handicap Children and Mary Rice Centre for Special Education presented cultural items on this day. The Board Members, Parents and Students and Staff attended the programme.

#### 5. Teachers' Day Celebration

A programme was organized by the Parents and Students of the school for the teachers in the morning. SWD organized another programme in the afternoon for the staff of both the units followed by lunch.

#### 6. <u>School Week</u>

School Week was organized from the 8<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> October 2018 at Mary Rice Centre. There were individual and group events like drawing, painting, singing, dancing, cookery, quiz, spell bee, fancy dress and different games like basketball, Danish rounders, filling the bucket, athletics etc. As the students belonged to 3 different house teams there was a lot of competition as well. When the results of all the events were declared, Red House emerged the winner and lifted the School Cup this year.

#### 7. Fundraising

A mini fete-cum-sale of craft items made by the students was organized on the 27<sup>th</sup> October 2018. Stalls and games were also put up on this day. Parents, Students, Staff, Volunteers and well wishers helped make it a success. The donor and sponsorship programme continues.

# 8. International Day for Persons with Disabilities

An Awareness cum Signature campaign was organised by the school in MUDA Complex, Police Bazaar on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2018. The public were made aware of the importance of including persons with disabilities in all sections of the society. Parents, Students and all the Staff participated in the programme.
